

Instructions for Group OSB Power Point Presentation

Knowledge: Use technology to explain and analyze the development of the literary term a novel best exemplifies.

Skills Assessed in this Project:

Able to create a Power Point presentation focused on one literary term as developed in a novel.

Able to make connections between a literary term and its development throughout a novel.

Product Instructions:

- Read a novel of your choice. Use this project for a novel that does a great job developing literary term(s)
- Choose **one literary term** (setting, conflict, theme, foreshadowing, plotline, irony, or symbolism) that the novel develops best. The best term to pick is one that changes throughout the book, or becomes more complex as the story develops. The only literary term that **you should not use** for this project is **character** (if you want to focus on the characters in your novel, do the character trading card project).
- Create a PP presentation of at least **5 slides** per person that show how the literary term is developed throughout the novel.

Divide up the presentation carefully since your presentation must include:

- **A Title slide** that identifies the **name of the book, author, and creator of the presentation**. Your title should match the **literary term** that you are focusing on in this project.
- An appropriate **graphic should be on each page**, including the title page. The graphic should relate as specifically as possible to the details in the card.
- An **analysis of the literary term** as it is developed throughout the novel.
- **A definition** of the term and show how it is first introduced in the novel.
- **Highlights** of the **important changes or developments** of the term as it progresses through the story.
- Be sure to relate the literary term to its importance in the novel.
- Be sure to **give examples (Cds) with commentary on each page and use 2 quotes per person with page #s** as support along with your explanation.
- **A strong conclusion** on the last slide. Like the conclusion of an essay, it should remind the viewer of the important aspects of your presentation.

Remember -

- A person who has not read the book should be able to view your presentation and understand it.
- Your presentation should not be cluttered with unnecessary animations, transitions, sounds, and other tricks that can be overused with PP.
- Your presentation should be professional and easy to understand, yet show a certain amount of your creativity.

Rubric (100 pts. Total):

90-100: The presentation:

Is complete, exceeding the expectations and requirements of the project
Is professional and not cluttered with unnecessary elements
Defines the literary term & clearly describes its importance
Does an excellent job of analyzing the term, showing how it is developed throughout the novel.
Uses relevant details and cites passages and examples from the novel to support your analysis.
The graphics and animations you chose for each slide enhance and support your analysis.
Your presentation makes sense to someone who is not familiar with the book.

80-89: The presentation:

Is complete and the expectations and requirements of the project were well met.
Is mostly professional, however it does have a few unnecessary elements (animations, transitions, noises, etc.).
Describes the literary term but could be more detailed
Analyzes the term, but some of your points are simplistic
Uses some passages and examples to support your analysis, but your presentation would be better if you had used more.
Has a graphic, but you could have used better graphics or animations to support your analysis.
Your presentation could make better sense to a person who is not familiar with the book.

70-79: The presentation:

Is complete and the expectations and requirements of the project were met, but at a basic level.
Is not very professional and has many unnecessary elements.
Uses a very basic description of the literary term that you have chosen and hastily describes how it develops throughout the novel.
Analyzes the term, but your analysis is simplistic.
Makes sparse use of details, passages from the novel, and examples to support your analysis.
Has a graphic, but it does not always match what you are discussing.
Makes some sense to a person who is not familiar with the book, though a viewer would have many questions

60-69: The presentation:

Is somewhat complete and the expectations and requirements of the project were poorly met.
Is not professional and is filled with unnecessary elements & convention errors
Poorly describes & develops a literary term
Makes little attempt to analyze the term
Uses some examples from the novel to support your point, but they are simplistic & far from the best.
Lacks graphics on some slides & is incomplete.
Makes little sense to a person who is not familiar with the book.

59 pts. & Below: The presentation :

Is seriously deficient in many areas and is quite incomplete.
The expectations and requirements of the project were not met.
